As we move into our second term in Crescent here are some updates:

#### **Covid 19 Procedures**

I would like to remind all parents that students displaying any symptoms of Covid 19 should not attend school and follow the required public health advice. By following this advice it is protecting yourself but also your fellow students and teachers. It appears that the situation has stabilised and I look forward to as normal a term as possible within the parameters of the current restrictions. I would like to thank all our parents and students for their co-operation over the last number of months.

#### **Pre-Examinations**

The Leaving Certificate pre - examinations begin on the 7 February. The timetables are available on Teams and the school app for students to access. The Junior Certificate pre -examinations begin on Wednesday 9 February. It is important for students to approach these exams with a view that they are a chance to get valuable exam practice. There will be plenty of time after the pre-examinations to reflect and plan for the next block of work towards June.

I would ask parents to be proactive and talk to your son/ daughter if they are attending a game regarding the need to behave in the appropriate manner and then we can enjoy the games in the spirit that school sport has always been associated with.
