Dear Parents/ Guardians

I hope all of you and your families are keeping well as we all adapt to a new school year in Crescent. The ninth characteristic of Jesuit education is for students to be 'adaptable and open to growth'. If Jesuit education is successful, there emerges from it young people who are adaptable and open to growth. A recent Superior General of the Society of Jesus, Peter Hans Kolvenbach put it thus: 'the world desperately needs men and women of competence, conscience and compassion, who generously give of them to others'.

It is a period of time currently that this Jesuit ideal has never been more relevant, the Covid pandemic has in my view reinforced the absolute need for all use to adapt and grow for all in society to prosper.

Some Updates:

<u>Student Behaviour</u>: I commend all of your sons and daughters for the positive way in which they have engaged with the current public health advice and measures that have been put in place to keep everyone safe so far. The students have been fantastic in adapting to any new routines in school. We are happy that students are getting plenty of fresh air at break times but we would like to stress that students should maintain social distancing in outdoor areas also as much as possible. 

<u>Sixth Year Retreats</u>: Our sixth year students went on day retreats today. Students travelled to workshop retreats in Castletown and Milford. Yoga retreats and Pilgrimage retreats to Ballina and the 12 O'Clock Hills were offered. Our retreat programme is a core part of our student experience in Crescent. Thanks to Gráinne Delaney and all our staff members who made it happen.

First Year Trips to Derg Isle: Settling into a new school can be a daunting experience. We currently have over 30 primary schools feeding into our intake so it's important to allow students to bond and mix. All our first year groups are going to Derg Isle and this is a great day to build on the initial friendships the classroom to the outdoor pursuits experience.



Student Facilities: Last week we got further good news as our Business in the Community Ireland group contacted the school. Our second year students had a successful connection with Eir as our partner business last year. Eir and their partner Huawei have now decided that Crescent will be one of only three schools in Ireland which will get the chance to be a Eir 5G school. Crescent will be partnered with a school in Switzerland. As part of this agreement Eir and Huawei are going to provide us with 20 tablets and an Ideahub interactive board for the school.

Parents Council A.G.M.: The Parents' Council A.G.M. will be held on the 30 September remotely via Zoom. Details of the Zoom link will be sent via the school app closer to the date.

Transition Year 2021: The Transition Years started off the year by participating in a workshop facilitated by a Limerick-based company called "Develop Me". The workshop began with the students being placed in engaging, interactive, fun scenarios with students then asked to work together to develop an approach aiming for a successful outcome. In preparation for the school show this year, the TYs took part in a drama workshop introducing the students to the skills required in a school show production. As part of National bike week, the TYs braved the elements and cycled the Great Southern Greenway, covering over 40km each day.

Over the next couple of weeks, the TY students will have the opportunity to take part in several different activities. These will include coaching our 1st years in a variety of different sports, the Young scientist award, Cansat, volunteering for the Homework Club and the Gaisce awards and we would encourage our TYs to take part in as many of these initiatives during the year. Over the next couple of weeks, our TYs have several activities to look forward to. At the end of the month, they will participate in the mini-marathon in aid of St Gabriel's, a charity heavily involved in the fast friend's programme within the school.

In October, TYs will be travelling to Derg Isle for a day of outdoor pursuits, and students will also take part in the first of our Gaisce adventure events by climbing Keepers Hill.

Work experience is an integral part of the Transition Year Programme, and already, our students have experienced the world of work. We are currently drawing up a list of companies who have kindly agreed to take Crescent students on work experience. <u>C.A.T.s First Year Tests</u>: The "Cognitive ability test" for first years will take place next Wednesday 22 September. These are a suite of tests developed to support schools in understanding students, abilities and likely academic potential. The tests access

- 1 Reasoning with words
- 2 Reasoning with numbers
- 3 Reasoning with shapes and designs
- 4 Thinking with and mentally manipulating precise shapes.

Peter Moloney will visit all the first year classes in advance of the testing to explain to the students regarding the test.

Captains Half Day & Calendar: Captains half day will take place on Friday 24 September with classes finishing at 12.35. As per the school calendar school is also closed on Monday 27 September.

<u>Arts & Culture in Crescent 2021/2022:</u> I am delighted to announce that we have a new initiative in Crescent as we have two Arts and Cultural officers to support the Arts in Crescent.
